1. CJ Pollacco and Joe Decker gave a short presentation about Nims (National Incident Management and the requirements that are needed to be in compliance and to get reimbursements. should a disaster occur. They want to help with the training and will come to the town and set up training for the Town board, building dept, dog control and any one else required to take the training.
2. Preservation Commission met with the Town Board to discuss the Preservation local law.
2. Several groups are looking to adopt a berm on the rail trail. They are in contact with the rail trail committee.
3. The County would take over the Safety net program over the next three years if they have flow control. The County legislative passed a flow control law but it has not been adopted by the State yet. The problem with that is the town would lose revenues from recyclables such as mulch, bottles metal.
4. Highway bought a new copier with the Nysesda appliance rebate program that has 75% rebate available.
5. We received from Ulster County a booklet to be more efficient, more effective more transparent and more sustainable. It is a guidebook to use as a resource to protect our environment.

6. We received a resignation from Mauve Mauer from the CAC and Rail Trail. We thank her for her many years of service.
